A. NREA/NREAC - Dan

 Dan presented the NREA and NREAC reports in writing previous to the meeting.
 He also indicated that the NREAC Agenda Setting Conference for 2020 is in DC on March 30, 31, April 1, 2020. Cathy Maloney will attend along with Dan this year.

B. MACSS - Linda

• The MACSS Executive Board will hold a conference call next Tuesday, January 28. The site of the State Spelling Bee, which has always been held in Billings, has been moved to the campus of MSU in Bozeman this year. The Spring Conference and Rural Teacher of the Year Banquet will be in Sidney, Montana April 21, 22 with the Award Banquet on the evening of the 22nd. A trip to Fort Union is in the plans. NREA Executive Director, Allen Pratt will be in attendance as well as MSSA Chair Jayne Downey.

C. MSU - Jayne

• MSU/UM has received a grant to prepare counselors for rural schools in exchange for a commitment to remain in the rural setting for a period of time. MSU also has received a grant to train rural educators. The grant received a match of 6.2 million from the federal government. That match involved 6.2 million committed by Montana schools and organizations such as the MSSA.

D. Western - Laura

• U of M Western is debating the re-introduction of an IA/Tech program on campus after discontinuing it at the campus and having it in conjunction with Helena College. They are considering teaming with the Highlands College in Butte as a more convenient and effective program. Currently, MSU - Bozeman has the only program in state.

E. MTSBA - Jan

Jan indicated that the MTSBA Board did not meet in January but will hold a
conference call on Thursday, January 23, 2020. MTSBA and MQEC have
representation in DC regarding the Espinoza case. That case is before the Supreme
Court determining the constitutionality of Montana's program to allow tax
deductible contributions to private schools. It has been ruled unconstitutional by
the Montana Constitution and is being challenged.

F. Office Manager - Linda Sunderlin

• Linda provided all financial data for the Board indicating that we continue to be on solid footing at MSSA. She also indicated that we have 99 school districts in our Consortium program, 102 Library Standards Districts, and 110 Counseling Standards Districts. We serve 1637 students in the Measured Academic Progress Testing Program and have 21 individual and 7 Institutional memberships in the NREA. She continues to work on the Rural Financial Data Survey with 75 schools. We will work with a new accounting firm this year, Mardel Scott and have a three year informal audit completed by the end of the calendar year.

G. Professional Development - Dean

Dean summarized our training for February which will be focused on mental health for students and staff. He indicated that we have secured Craig Falcon for April's conferences and the focus is on IEFA. The history of Montana tribes through tribal eyes, Native American Cultural Awareness and Native American Games will also be a focus during the day. Potential topics for 2020-2021 will include NGSS Science Standards, Digital Citizenship, STEAM and STEM in the classroom and writing strategies could also be addressed.
